Print Production Process

Our images are printed at the highest resolution using custom profiles, printing on-site to achieve accurate colours and neutral black and whites.

Note: Images printed using 'generic' canvas settings produce inaccurate results. Other Artists may use cheap canvases and print at lower resolution and by doing so provide inferior prints.

Canvas Quality and Longevity

Our canvas is certified 'Archival Quality' by the 'Fine Art Trade Guild'. It is a superior canvas, has exceptional colour reproduction qualities. Unlike cheaper canvas it does not contain whitening agents ensuring the image remains consistently true over time.

Note: Canvases using whitening agent eventually discolour.

Note: Companies offering very fast turnaround times are not allowing canvases to 'outgas' canvases require a minimum 24 hours to allow water to evaporate from the ink during the drying stage, prior to varnishing.

Canvas Protection

We use Museum Grade Varnish that soaks into the canvas offering superior protection from moisture and scuffs. Our Matte Varnish gives a superior finish. Gloss and Satin finishes are also available.

Note: Cheap Canvases are heat sealed; this does offer good protection but always has a semi-matte finish and visible film coating.

Stretcher Bars

Our stretcher bars are solid laminated pine, ensuring they are light enough to hang on standard picture hooks but are heavier, more robust and are a better quality than the cheap 'fir bars' often used.

Finishing

Our canvases are carefully finished with framing tape and felt bumpers and fitted with a custom steel hanger compatible with standard picture hooks.
